



<b>Getting Started</b>	
<b>What is it?</b>	Bibme is a free citation manager which provides a personal account to create bibliographies in MLA, APA, Chicago, or Turabian style.
<b>Signing up</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Go to <b><a href="http://www.bibme.org">http://www.bibme.org</a></b></li> <li>2. Click on <b>Register</b> up at the top.</li> <li>3. Sign up for an account.</li> </ol>
<b>Adding Citations</b>	
<b>Methods</b>	<p>There are 2 methods for adding citations– <b>Autofill</b> or <b>Manual Entry</b>. The autofill search looks through very few resources and will probably not retrieve the needed item. Manual mode is used most often.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Select the resource type by clicking the correct tab: Book, Magazine, Newspaper, Website, Journal, Film, or Other.</li> <li>2. Select method below.</li> </ol> <div style="text-align: center;"> </div>
<b>Autofill mode</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Type in title or other information as listed in the search box.</li> <li>2. Click <b>Select</b> ✓ next to those items to add to bibliography.</li> </ol>
<b>Manual Entry mode</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fill out all the information that you have on the resource.</li> <li>2. Click Add to my bibliography</li> </ol>

<p><b>Retrieve lists</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Click on list from left.</li> <li>2. Select list from left side column</li> </ol>
<p><b>Sharing lists</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Click on Share</li> <li>2. Copy link presented.</li> <li>3. Email to others.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Editing lists</b></p>	<p><b>Edit:</b> Edit items on list</p> <p><b>Rename:</b> Rename the list</p> <p><b>Delete:</b> Delete the list</p>
<p><b>Download</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Select citation format.</li> <li>2. Click Download.</li> </ol>
